Important Dates – Special Conditions and Closures	<p>Spring opening dates: The Othello Tunnels area of this park is subject to an annual inspection for rock and debris fall hazard prior to the opening day (typically May long-weekend). BC Parks must complete all scaling and park preparation prior to the Spring opening to ensure the Park is safe for public use. Weather and other factors can limit when this work is completed. Safety concerns may limit opportunities to film prior to this time.</p> <p>When the Park is open: Filming is not likely to be permitted on weekends or holidays to avoid interference with public use and access.</p> <p>Spring opening to October 15th: BC Parks will require conditions to filming activities that may limit the viability of filming in this park in order to ensure public access and to maintain the park experience.
